DeZIM was established in 2017 as a non-university research institute in the field of integration and migration. As a federal departmental research institution, it performs research and development tasks in the areas of family, gender equality, children and youth, senior citizens and engagement policy.

The department deals with international, cross-border migrations with the target region Europe/Germany as the main focus. Migration processes are examined from various points of view: These include mobility aspirations and capabilities or processes leading to migration decisions, legal categories of migration, its criminalization and the resulting social phenomena, governance of mobility and border policies, and consequences of migration for social change. Research in the department is examined from different disciplinary perspectives, using both qualitative and quantitative methods.
